



## **Beyond Words Festival**

## 12 – 21 May 2023, at the Institut français

The Institut français in London is pleased to announce the 7th edition of Beyond Words, a **week-long festival of literature** featuring acclaimed authors and new voices, and the latest publications from both sides of the Channel.

Guest of honour of this year's festival, Ian McEwan will be awarded the insignia of Commandeur in the Ordre des Arts et des Lettres by French Ambassador Hélène Duchêne on Wed 17 May.

Ian McEwan will then present his new novel, *Lessons*, a compelling reflexion on history and humanity.

The line-up includes **luminaries of French literature**, from **Muriel Barbery**, author of the global sensation *The Elegance of the Hedgehog*, **Éric Vuillard**, recipient of the 2017 Prix Goncourt, to **Laurent Mauvignier**, author of *The Birthday Party*, longlisted for the International Booker Prize 2023. **Jean-Baptiste Andrea**, author of *Devils and Saints* and **Antoine Laurain**, bestselling author of *The Red Notebook* will also attend the festival.

Women literary greats are in the spotlight with a series of events dedicated to Colette on the 150th anniversary of her birth, including a discussion with Deborah Levy, Michèle Roberts, Emmanuelle Lambert and Diana Holmes; and a special screening of *Gigi*, attended by Leslie Caron. Virginia Woolf's *Orlando* will be the starting point of a discussion with writer and philosopher Paul B. Preciado. The festival will also feature Nobel Prize-winner Annie Ernaux's directorial debut, *The Super 8 Years*, and films by or adapted from Marguerite Duras.

More films are on the menu with a documentary on **Milan Kundera**, and *Loving Highsmith*, a unique look at the life of **Patricia Highsmith**. Director **Nina Menkes** will also present her documentary *Brainwashed: Sex – Camera – Power*, addressing the representation of women on screen and in society.

Poet and artist **Tarek Lakhrissi** will explore the themes of desire, queer poetic and empowerment through a reading followed by a conversation with curator **Lynton Talbot**.

Kids can also join a programme of reading sessions, a workshop with illustrator **Pauline Kerleroux**, and (re)discover the magic of Disney's now classic adaptation of Lewis Carroll's *Alice in Wonderland*.

Last but not least, Beyond Words goes on tour with its **Beyond Our Walls** programme featuring a special conversation with **Éric Vuillard** at the Maison Française d'Oxford, **Olivier Guez** at the British Library, **Caroline Laurent** in Bristol and **François Beaune** in Scotland.
